Preface by Anna Scavuzzo, Deputy Mayor of the Municipality of Milan, in charge of Food Policy and Education

Four years of commitment that with the European project Food Wave saw the Municipality of Milan, together with 28 international partners, involve over 200,000 young people and inform over 20 million from all over Europe through street actions, awareness-raising events, sustainable picnics, forums, schools and workshops, film festivals, exhibitions, performances and art contests.

A great work that aimed to inform, raise awareness and communicate on food and climate issues, making young people an active part of city-wide activities.

2015 saw a wonderful Universal Exposition in Milan, EXPO2015 - Feeding the Future, Energy for Life, which entrusted an important legacy to the first one hundred mayors who signed the Milan Urban Food Policy Pact: a network of cities from all over the world committed to making food policies sustainable, as an integral part of the political agendas of their urban communities. In Milan, this commitment became a reality with the implementation of the Food Policy, the city's food policy, the framework in which the actions of the Food Wave project were also included. Today, Milan continues to lead the network of the Milan Urban Food Policy Pact, with more than 270 adhering cities.

These years of activity have made it possible to consolidate the relationship between urban policies and food policies, concretising actions aimed at guaranteeing access to healthy food and clean water for all, working to fight waste, improving logistics and investing in healthy and sustainable production.

Thank you all for being here in Milan to close this incredible Food Wave experience, for being and continuing to be an active part of change!

Food Wave project

The Project FOOD WAVE: Empowering Urban Youth For Climate Action is a European project, funded by the European Commission under the programme "DEAR - Raising public awareness of development issues and promoting development education in European Union and implemented in the framework of the Municipality's Food Policy.

Its main objective is to increase the knowledge, awareness and engagement of young Europeans between 15 and 35 years old on sustainable practices of food consumption and production for climate change mitigation and adaptation.

The Municipality of Milan joined the European Food Wave project as Lead Partner of a partnership composed of 28 partners based in 17 different countries. The project aims to create a dialogue between institutions and young people (aged 15 to 35) for a green, inclusive and sustainable future for our cities. In particular, the project focuses on the importance of sustainable urban food systems and the adoption of responsible lifestyles and eating habits of young people for climate change mitigation.



The project's awareness-raising and communication activities were aimed at informing and involving young people through a web platform and a digital communication and information campaign supported by an international network of more than 250 ambassadors and digital content creators. The project produced specific research and studies on the food/climate nexus and the active involvement of young people was central through online and offline activities, including urban games, activism schools involving hundreds of young people in Europe, discussion forums, international exchanges, art competitions and film festivals.



















Objectives and achievements

To date, Food Wave has reached - between in-presence activities and online communication more than 20 million citizens between Europe and Brazil and has created links with stakeholders and policy makers, international organisations, civil society organisations, networks of young people who have recognised the importance and innovativeness of the project



In four years, Food Wave has created a true international network: 17 European countries, 16 international cities including Milan, Turin (Italy), Warsaw (Poland), Zagreb (Croatia), Sofia (Bulgaria), Madrid (Spain), Murcia (Spain), Malmö (Sweden), Almere (Netherlands), São Paulo (Brazil), Bruges (Belgium), Molenbeek (Belgium), Nea Smyrni (Greece), Pest (Hungary), Brasov (Romania), Risteco (France), 13 civil society organisations, including ActionAid Italia, Fondazione ACRA, Mani Tese, REDE DLBC Lisbon, Groundwork Greater Manchester, ReLondon, Association for Local Democracy - ALDA, Risteco, Alianza por la Solidaridad, BJCEM - Biennale des Jeunes Créateurs d'Europe et de la Méditerranée, Erasmus Student Network Italia, ActionAid Hellas and RRA Podravje Maribor.

Through training projects, workshops and events, the impact of Food Wave had a European resonance. The activities realised thanks to Food Wave have engaged about 1000 activists and students trained in 42 schools, almost 2000 young people from the suburbs of European cities trained in over 90 cycles of workshops on sustainability and more than 100,000 participants in 95 street performances in Europe.

In the city of Milan, in order to bring teenagers closer to the themes of sustainability and the environmental impact of food, in 2021 and 2023, 17 associations and informal groups of young people were financed by the Municipality of Milan through two calls for proposals that have promoted a programme of street actions, concerts, artistic performances artistic performances, workshops, cooking laboratories and communication activities, such as podcasts and radio programmes.



















The event Feed Your Future: urbanizing food solutions

2023 marks the closing phase of the project, a moment of reflection on what has been learnt and achieved, but also an opportunity to involve citizens in a collective discussion on the future.

From 22 to 25 November, the Municipality of Milan together with ActionAid Italia, Fondazione ACRA and Mani Tese and Will Media organised "Feed Your Future, Urbanizing Food Solutions": three days of public and institutional events aimed at reconsidering the relationship with food and to jointly identify solutions to transform it.

The aim of the event is to carry out an interactive return with collective brainstorming, together with the Food Wave partners, meet the Food Wave beneficiaries and involve the citizenship in this final phase of the project.

The places of the event

The Feed Your Future event will be hosted by the city of Milan, and will be spread over several locations in the city that reflect the theme of the event, each with unique characteristics that enhance the choice of different spaces

1. Palazzo Stelline ((22nd November)

2.

Located in the heart of the city, Palazzo Stelline is a prestigious venue that houses the Italian representative offices of European institutions such as the European Commission and the European Parliament. The venue is located in the historic center of Milan, famous for its rich cultural heritage, artistic atmosphere and lively food and shopping scene.

2. Mare Culturale Urbano (23rd November)

Mare is an artistic production center established in 2012 and housed within the Cascina Torrette is an asset of the Milan City Council and represents the final piece of the Cenni di Cambiamento project, a social housing complex offering an innovative housing solution based on the culture of sustainable, collaborative and community living. Mare's activities promote art as a tool for mixing and dialogue for purposes that are social, going from being a cultural project to a place that creates and encloses a community.

3. Municipio 1, Palazzo Marino (24th November)

The historical Palazzo that houses the Council Headquarters of City Hall 1 in Milan is Palazzo Marino, a building of great historical and architectural importance, located in the heart of the city center. The Palazzo is built in Renaissance style and is located in Piazza della Scala, one of Milan's most prestigious squares, near important cultural venues such as the Teatro alla Scala and the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II. Inside the building is the Council Chamber, where the meetings and administrative activities of the City Hall take place.

4. Baroni 85 (24th November)

This space, which until 2022 housed a kindergarten, is home to a centre in which the municipality offers services, meeting and social spaces to the girls and boys of Gratosoglio aged between 15 and 25. The services offered are workshops to counter the phenomenon of youth unemployment by offering a place where they can cultivate interests, share social moments and find their own way.

5. Cascina Nascosta (25th November)

The building of a typical Lombard farmstead represents a unique place in the context of the Festival, located within the urban fabric of the city in the natural setting of Sempione Park. This building belonging to the City of Milan, managed in collaboration with Legambiente, is a city reference space for individuals, associations, companies and producers who want to put sustainable habits at the centre of their daily lives, contributing to the creation of an inclusive city context, attentive to the environment and open to sharing experiences.
